SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family, or any
male over 18 years old, may home-
stead a quarter section of available
Dominion land in Manitoba, Sas-
katchewan or Alberta. Applicant must
appear in person at the Dominion
Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the
District. Entry by proxy may be
made at any Dominion Lands
Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on
certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon
and cultivation of the land in each
three years. A homesteader may
live within nine miles of his home-
stead on a farm of at least 80 acres,
on certain conditions. A habitable
house is required except where resi-
dence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader
in good standing may pre-empt a
quarter-section alongside his home-
stead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in
each of three years after earning home-
stead patent; also 50 acres extra
cultivation. Pre-emption patent may
be obtained as soon as homestead
patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his
homestead right may take a purchas-
ed homestead in certain districts.
Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must
reside six months in each of three
years; cultivate 50 acres and erect
a house worth \$200.

The area of cultivation is subject
to reduction in case of rough, scrubby
or stonyland. Live stock may be
substituted for cultivation under cer-
tain conditions.
