By the record majority voters of Berlin yesterday their disapproval of Mayor Hahn's candidacy, and by the lead did they elect W. L. Schmalz their Mayor for 1911.

The magnificent majority a surprise to even the most sanguine Schmalz supporters was no doubt in the mind of Schmalz's supporters. They would recognize the change in the chief magistracy also the ability of Mr. Schmalz to fill the position, but in two months' organization ex-Mayor Hahn and his most sanguine Schmalz supporters did not figure on a majority of more than 200. Consequently the election came as a pleasant surprise to Schmalz and his many friends.

The vote polled was 2548. In 1909 the total vote on Monday it was 2548. The vote polled in the history of the city.

More interest was taken in the election on Monday than in any other for many years. The voters recognized the fact that the principle of good civic government was at stake. Schmalz's defeat would have been a blow. The electors, however, would elect the better man. They did, by one of the most just and equitable presentations of any candidate.

The result was never in doubt. The first poll gave Schmalz a majority, and he never lost it.

## THE REEVES

The victory of Reeve was not a surprise. It was expected that the fight between he and Gross, and was close until the last moments were received, and then his lead.

## THE COUNCIL

The surprise in the election was the big vote for Messrs. Kranz, Mills, Pieper. It was expected that Clement would be well represented by the other candidates. Such a splendid showing was unexpected. It demonstrates conclusively, however, that good candidates are always assured of the support of the electors of Berlin.
