Italy and England

One of the most remarkable developments in European politics is the determination of Italy to come to England's assistance in the east.

Last week the report of the Canadian minister of militia was made public, and the following extract from Major-General Johnston's report, included therein, was sent from Ottawa, under date of the 5th or 6th:

It has already been decided that another artillery school of instruction shall be formed in Italy, and I would beg to suggest the necessity of this being carried out as soon as possible.
