THE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

The Watford Horticultural Society certainly justified its existence in 1921 by transforming the Federal Square from being an eyesore to the town to a spot of beauty we were proud to point out to our visitors.

As a proof of the way Watfordites old and young appreciated the change; not a flower was picked, not a plant destroyed or trampled, not withstanding many dismal prophecies to the contrary.

There was a membership of 75 last year, there should be twice that number this year and every family in the town should have at least one member on the list.

Recognizing the fact that the School Fair cultivates in our children a love of the beautiful and the useful in nature the Society gave the Fair liberal support which will be continued this fall.

There will be two free lectures given by Government specialists during the season.

Last Fall some 3000 bulbs were purchased in Holland at a low cost for members and as the shippers sent about 500 extra these were tucked into the Federal Square. Watch for them this Spring. The Society expects this Fall to give bulbs free to its members and will be glad to assist at any time in selecting trees, plants, shrubs etc., and will purchase and deliver these at actual cost if desired by members.

Premiums were given last year to the amount of about 50c. This year you get practically your whole dollar back.

Each member is entitled to one choice only of the following premiums free and requests must be in by March 20th.

Choice 1—Gladoli—15 bulbs. Carefully selected, named varieties. Easy to grow, and very beautiful.

Choice 2—Rose Bushes—2 Hybrids. Three years old. Choice stock imported from Holland. Can be successfully grown in Watford.

Choice 3—Cannas—15 dormant roots of the large, green foliage variety. Make fine background for other flowers. Grow 6 to 8 ft. high. Small red flower. These roots were grown by Mr. Bate.

Choice 4—Seeds—Flower or vegetable. Members choosing this premium will be given an order on P. Dodds & Son good for 75c worth of seeds, any variety member selects.

If you wish your premium used to help beautify the Federal Square instead of delivering it to you, put a cross before this sentence.

Members from the country round Watford will be cordially welcomed. Cut out this list pin a dollar bill to it, or more if you can spare it, and hand or send it to one of the officers of the Society.

The Council showed its appreciation of the work that is being done by giving the Society a grant of \$50.

Members will call at Watford homes during the next week; have your choice ready for them.
