The heifer that has never been milked, knows nothing about it, is sick and weak, and perhaps frightened with tanks that lack the toughness of old cows...

On Butter Making.

No one should attempt to churn cream but the first method thoroughly but in this last working, less one of the secrets of the art. The mass should be broken, as much as possible, instead of being cut with the ladle, and pressure should be used instead of a drawing motion on the handle of the butter.

Another dairyman draws the ladle over the butter after cutting it down thoroughly into the water, until it leaves a shining greasy head, and this butter will not harden readily even in a low temperature; in summer it is oily in a warm room; in a very few moments it has lost its 'grain' as it is termed and lost it by injudicious handling.

Butter should be handled with care to this fine quality of its composition, and while it is essential to work it thoroughly, it must be done by pressure, avoiding a sliding of the ladle over its surface. I have never seen a butter worker that I considered equal to the old fashioned ladle for this purpose, though the lighter women's work in the common dairy and hence are an appreciable innovation.—Cor. Dairy.
