SIR,

I have the honour to refer to your Note and annexed Memorandum of Understanding dated June 25, 1970, concerning the Agreement on Air Defence and Related Cooperation effected by the exchange of Notes of June 12, 1961. (1) I also have the honour to refer to the recent discussions between the representatives of our two Governments concerning the furnishing of 66 F-101 B/F aircraft and related support equipment by the United States Government, the receiving in return of 58 CF-101 aircraft, and Canada's undertaking to operate certain radar stations through July 31, 1971.

The proposals contained in your Note and annexed Memorandum of Understanding are acceptable to the Government of Canada and it is agreed that your Note and this reply, which is authentic in English and French, shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments on these matters which shall enter into force on the date of this Note.

Please accept, Sir, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
