excellent method of dealing with the same kind of transaction, although it involved a House give unanimous consent to continue slightly different approach than that taken the consideration of this bill beyond six by the hon. Member for Spadina. It would have been useful, however, to have that bill and I am sorry that the hon. Member did not see fit to introduce it.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Batten): Order. The hour for the consideration of private Members' business has expired.

Mr. Peters: On a question of privilege, Mr. Speaker, would you ascertain from the committee whether or not there is unanimous consent to allow the hon. Member to continue, so we can give second reading to this bill this afternoon?
