Mr. Garland (Bow River)—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. Did the Post Office Department employ Mr. McWorth, underwriters' operative, for six months in the City of Montreal?

2. If so, what salary did Mr. McWorth receive per month?
3. What was the occasion for his employment?
4. To whom was he directly responsible?

Mr. Garland (Bow River)—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. What is the total salary allowed the Governor General and paid by the Dominion of Canada?

2. What additional allowances are paid the Governor General?
3. What was the total cost of the yearly maintenance of Rideau Hall from 1928 to 1930?
4. What was the total travelling expenses of the Governor General for the years 1928, 1929 and 1930?
5. What are the other expenses incidental to the position paid by the Dominion of Canada?

2. What is the amount of travelling expenses to Robert Hill, mechanical equipment employee of the Post Office Department for each of the years, 1928, 1929 and 1930?
3. What is the amount paid by the Post Office Department for padlocks for tie sacks in each year from 1914 to date, inclusive?
4. From whom were they purchased?
5. Have they proved to be efficient and satisfactory?

Mr. Smith (Cumberland)—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. Is the Rail and River Coal Company, Cleveland, Ohio, still owned and operated by the Canadian National Railways?

2. If so, what number of men were engaged in 1930 and at the present time by said company?
3. Is union or non-union labour employed at the mines of the said company?
4. What was the total production of coal from the mines of the Rail and River Coal Company for the year 1930?
5. How much of the output from the mines of said company was taken by the Canadian National Railways, and what was the price paid per ton at pit-mouth for the year 1930?
6. Is there a contract between the Canadian National Railways and the Rail and River Coal Company to supply coal to the railways?
7. If so, what are the terms of said contract, and, if it is on a cost basis, what is the cost per ton?
8. What amount does the Canadian National Railways pay annually for interest on bonds, maintenance and other charges in any way connected with the said Rail and River Coal Company?
