Hemp, undressed.

Hides and skins, undressed.

Ivory nuts. Logs and round unmanufactured tim-ber.

Lumber and timber, plank and board sawn, not shaped or otherwise manufactured.

Minerals.

Newspapers, magazines, etc.

Oils, cocoa-nut and palm.

Pitch, tar and pine.

Rags, resin. Salt.

Silk, raw, or as reeled from the cocoon. Seeds.
