HISTORICAL MEMORIAL
 OF THE
 NEGOTIATION
 OF
 FRANCE and ENGLAND.

HIS Majesty thinks it consistent with his good-
 ness and justice, to inform his subjects of the
 endeavours he has used, and the sacrifices he
 resolved to make, in order to restore peace to his
 kingdom.

France, and the whole universe, will judge from a
 plain and faithful detail of the negotiation which has
 been carried on between the courts of Versailles and
 London, which of the two courts have been averse to
 the re-establishment of public tranquillity, and have
 sacrificed the common peace and welfare to their own
 ambition.

In order to form a clear and just opinion with regard
 to the negotiation which has lately broken off between
 France and England, it is necessary to recollect the motives
 which occasioned the rupture between the two crowns,
 and the particular circumstances which have involved
