I would like to call the attention of the house to clause 3 of the Municipal union's recommendation: "That in the opinion of this executive it is essential for the success of a publicly owned telephone system throughout the province of Munitoha that local exchanges should be built in the chief centres, such as Winnipeg, Brandon and Portage in Prairie, therefore it is desirable, should these numlcipalities take no action in the matter of establishing numicipal telephone system by the lifst of April next, that upon receiving a requisition from a sufficient number of ratepayers desiring to become users of the telephone to enable systems to be constructed in these respective centres upon a reminerative basis, the government shall proceed,

without delay, to establish a local ex-

without delay, to establish a local ex-change telephone service in any one of these places, or in all of them."

"The date, April I next, calls for in-nedlate action by the municipalities named in the resolution, and I trust that they will immediately consider what action they desire to take. The publication of the Municipal union's report obviates the necessity for further comment on the provisions of the bills now under consideration.
