MRS. MINNIE DIXON TELLS HER STORY IN COURT.

Says for Husband Abused Her with His Tongue and Also Slapped and Other-wise Ill-Used Her-Their Life in Al-pena, Mich., and in Chatham-The Judge Denounced the Doctor.

Chatham, Ont., March 25.—This morning the case of Dixon v. Dixon for nonsupport was again taken up at the Police Court. Mr. Walker argued that the case could not proceed on the grounds that remedy had been sought in the high court, but his objection was not sustained and the trial went on.

The complainant, Minnie Dixon, was the first witness called by Mr. Pike, and proved an exceedingly good one. She testified that she was the legal wife of the defendant. They had lived together as man and wife for some four months after marriage in Toronto. Defendant did not thrash her during that time, though they had repeated quarrels, Dixon generally being the aggressor.

They then went to Alpena, Mich., where they resided together, During that time defendant thrashed complainant, struck her on the street, dragged her up stairs by the arm and abused her in many other ways. During this time an uncle of Mrs. Dixon paid all the expenses of the couple. A child was born to Mrs. Dixon in Alpena. It was still born.

Their Life is Chatham.

Complainant, proceeding, stated that they then came to Chatham, she preceding the defendant. Since coming to Chatham he had abused her, slapped her twice and called her vile names. On one occasion he told her he would spot, her face with vitrol or carbolic acie if she asked him again for money. St. was willing to live with him if she could be protected against cruelty.
