A Newspaper Case. A point of interest to newspaper men came up for decision before Mr. Justice Robertson at Osgoode Hall yesterday. One William Neil sued W. H. Norman, a country correspondent of The St. Thomas Times, for \$500 for alleged libel contained in a letter written by Norman to the newspaper, charging Neil with drunkenness. On Norman's application, Judge Robertson granted an order that Neil furnish security for costs of the action, on the ground that Norman stood in the position of an editor, and, as such, was entitled to the security under the Libel Act. From this order, S. A. Jones, acting for Neil, appealed yesterday. Mr. Justice Robertson allowed the appeal, holding that only a publisher, editor or owner of a newspaper was entitled to such security.

HAVE STEADYING EFFECT.

Trust Organizer Morgan Says Steel Combine Will Not Hurt British Market. London, April 12.—Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, in an interview with a London reporter, is quoted as saying he thought the proposed steel combine would have a steadying effect on the British steel market, and rather more favorable than otherwise. He did not think that the steel trade should suffer either in Great Britain or Germany. As to the report that it intended to place trust securities on the European market, Mr. Morgan said: "The people on this side are under a misapprehension. All the shares were let long ago. What we bought we had to pay for."

Receipts for Mission Work. New York, April 12.—At the session today of the New York East Conference of the M.E. Church, Dr. E. L. Baldwin, recording-secretary of the Missionary Society, presented the report, showing that the receipts of the society amounted to \$1,322,820; of the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society \$1,187,868, and of the Woman's Christian Temperance Society \$240,868, making a total of \$1,851,556. The receipts for foreign missions were \$1,175,382 and for home missions \$715,427.

Babonite Student. Chicago, April 12.—A special to The Record-Herald from Ann Arbor, Mich., says: Dr. Novy, when asked regarding the condition of Charles B. Hare, the student who is supposed to have been bitten by a snake, said:

"Nothing yet has been decided. He is recovering rapidly. He is out of bed, and walks around occasionally inside the contagious ward." Student Cummings, who is caring for Hare, has not caught any infection, and precautions are still being applied to him.

No Bank of Scotland Notes Forged. Edinburgh, April 12.—The Bank of Scotland denies all knowledge of the forging of their bank notes of £20 by the alleged forgers, John A. Skog and Emil Molberg, now in custody in New York, and says that no counterfeit notes of their own have come to their notice. The police of Edinburgh also deny the charge of the counterfeiting of Scotch bank notes.

ON A "WAR RISK" BASIS. Extra Prices Charged for Insurance on Vessels Bound for the Far East. San Francisco, April 12.—The Examiner says: Vessels bound from this coast to China and Japan are being put on a "war risk" basis. This means a heavy addition to the usual rates of insurance, and comes in the class of special hazards. The reason for this action on the part of marine underwriters is the strained relationship between Japan and Russia.
