Thunder Spoiled Game.

New York, April 21.—A terrific thunder and rain storm broke over American League Park on Wednesday night, this afternoon, and spoiled what promised to be an interesting baseball game, the initial one of the season, between the Washington and New York teams. Nearly 20,000 persons were present. Before the third inning had been completed the thunder storm broke and the spectators in the open stands jumped down upon the field. A riot seemed imminent, but the police kept the crowd well in check as they fled toward the box seats and the crowd checks. The supply of these was very limited and the management of the club saw that it was probable some persons would be injured in the mad rush. Accordingly it was announced that there would be no admission charged for the game which will be played here between the same clubs next Monday. Umpire Connolly refused to call the game until the home club had sent Elberfeld to the opening of the final half of the fourth inning and the crowd showed its displeasure at his action by cheering the Washingtons when they knocked out three runs of Chesbro's pitching in their half of the fourth inning, making the score 8 to 1 in favor of Washington. The course, under the rules does not make any mark in the championship series.

THE RIGHT SORT.

Clergyman Tells How He Found His Brother in the North West.

George Sanderson, Manchester, was a clerk, in a large counting house. He had a fine position, and lived the life of a gentleman. A year ago, he was bitten with the fever of travel and adventure. He had heard much about Canada, and especially he had read the letters of the British journalist who had been sent out to tell their experiences. He suddenly gave up his position and came to this country, taking up land in Alberta, his hope was to establish a ranch in the course of time.

His brother, the Rev. James Sanderson, a Church of England clergyman, thought he would like to take a holiday, chiefly in order to see this adventurous brother of his. Mr. Sanderson has been to the North-West, and on Thursday, Montreal, at the Windsor Station, he described what he saw.

When he reached his brother's place he saw a young man standing in the rude doorway of a shack. The rain was coming down, the shack seemed huddled. The young man's face was as red as that of an Indian; his clothes were patched, the white collar and cuffs of former days were gone. The clergyman cried when he saw his brother in this plight. He could not help it. He contrasted his present condition with that which the young man had in the Old Country, and he begged him, for heaven's sake to come back with him.

"Well," said Mr. Sanderson, "he simply laughed at me. He said that he was on the road to fortune; that he simply delighted in the free life of the open; that he had made this shack and loved it; that he was free from care; and that in ten years he would be a rich man.

"Of course," said Mr. Sanderson, "after the first shock, I got used to the thing a bit myself. I could see that this was an immense country with a future to it, and during the fortnight that I went about with my brother, I was converted to his way of thinking. Of course, there is much which would shock a person accustomed to the sediments of life. On the other hand, every man is the architect of his own fortune, which is certainly not the case in the Old Country, where caste still prevails, more or less.

"On the whole, I am reconciled, and will certainly when I go back, be able to recommend my countrymen to come to Canada, not to make fortunes in a day or a year, but to lay the foundations for a comfortable independence.

ITALIAN STRIKE MAY BE SETTLED.

Rome, April 21.—The strike may be considered to have ended. A committee of socialists has obtained from the Italian Government a promise to study a scheme for arbitration to be adopted in the case of difference between railroad men and the government. In future the latter will consult the representatives of the railroad organizations with the view of ascertaining their requirements and proposals. It was also agreed that if the strike ceased promptly there will be no punishment, transfer or other punishment.

On this understanding with the government other telegrams were sent to the railroad men throughout Italy notifying them that they were free to return to work and ready to resume their former employment.

WILL PUT UP DRIED APPLES.

New Industry Projected For Port Williams, N. S.—Personal News.

Kings County, N. S., April 20.—A company has been organized at Port Williams for the establishment of a canning factory, which will manufacture evaporated apples and applesauce. The capital of the company is to be about \$100,000, of which some \$40,000 is deemed ample for the present needs. A large number of the fruit-growers are interested in the scheme and the idea is supposed to have been brought to a climax because of the low prices the fruit has brought this season. The factory will be erected at Port Williams during the summer, and it is expected that the balance of the stock to be issued, will be taken up, and the permanent organization of the company completed in a few weeks.
