"Mr. Chesterton is taking too much care of the Jewish people, and it is not his business," said Dr. Shmarya Levin, in the course of an interview with a representative of the Toronto Globe. Dr. Levin is a well-known leader in the Zlonist movement, and has his headquarters in Palestine. He is an enthusiastic believer in the Palestinian lestiny of the Jewish people.

"Have you read Mr. Chesterton's book, "The New Jerusalem?" was the first question put to Dr. Levin.

"Yes, and I think his attitude is not justified," replied the doctor. "Mr. Chesterton is taking too much care of the Jewish people and it is not his business. The Jews are not going to live according to his ideas. It is true that the Jew is an Oriental, but he is only Oriental in spirit, and Mr. Chesterton forgets that in the wanderings of the Jewish people throught the nations they have adapted themselves to European civilization."

"But it is not true that the Jewish people do not become part of a community and are not assimilated?" asked the Globe.
