C., Aug. 3—A legal battle to test the right of the Dominion government to tax liquor coming into this province is expected to result from the probable seizure, by federal authorities, of a shipment of Scotch whiskey now on its way from England. The case may go all the way to the Privy Council, according to a statement by Attorney-General J. W. DeB. Farris. He said he would contend that under the British North America Act liquor importations by the provincial government are exempt from federal taxation, as the act stipulates that "property of the province is not liable to taxation."
