"His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick, Fredericton (N. B.): "The day of thanksgiving for the conclusion of hostilities was prematurely anneed in the press for the 17th. Paris, Nov. 15-(British Wireless Service)-Admiral Sir Roslyn Wemyss. who was appointed to notify the German effvoys of the naval conditions of the armistice, is credited by Le Figaro with a phrase which admirably reflects respective positions of the two fleets.

"It is inadmissible," the Germans protested, "that our fleet should be given up without having been beaten."

Reports from Germany More Hopeful
