

DROWNING IN MIRAMICHI S.W. RIVER

Wesley Connors, of Upper Blackville Loses Life and Young Son Narrowly Escapes Father's Fate.

Fredericton, Nov. 27.—Wesley Connors, of Upper Blackville, broke through the ice while crossing the Southwest Branch of the Miramichi river, near his home, yesterday, and was drowned. His ten-year-old son who was crossing the river at the same time, was rescued by several men who heard his cries for help.

Mr. Connors and his son were on their way home when the fatal accident occurred, both of them breaking through the ice at the same point. The boy shouted for help and several men who were on shore near by ran to the assistance of Mr. Connors and his son.

When they reached the hole in the ice the father had sunk while the boy was making frantic efforts to catch hold of the ice. He was pulled out by rescuers but was unable to give any particulars of the accident. He told the men amid tears that "papa was in the hole."

Mr. Connors was about 50 years of age and is survived by a widow and four sons.

SCHEER, ROY ABANDONED.
London, Nov. 27.—The captain and crew of the American schooner Rob Roy have arrived at Morador, Morocco, in a motor boat. The Rob Roy ran into a gale on Nov. 18, while bound from Alicante, Spain, for Havana. Buffeted by the high waves and leaking, the schooner was abandoned on Nov. 20 ninety miles north-east of Madeira. She was then in a sinking condition.

The Rob Roy was a four-masted schooner of 788 tons. She was owned in Philadelphia and was built at Camden, N. J., in 1890. The Rob Roy sailed from New York Aug. 30 for Lisbon on her previous voyage.

COUNCIL DECIDES TO GET INFORMATION ON ADVANCED MILK PRICE

Investigation Which May Take in Other Lines of Foods May Follow—The Elevator Site.

At the meeting of the common council yesterday the matter of accepting the offer of \$28,670 for the city lots on Prince William street was left over until Thursday. The Mayor was empowered to confer with the solicitor in regard to the necessary steps to be taken to hold an inquiry into the proposed increase in the price of milk. The Mayor submitted a statement showing how the good streets which we have heard so much about in other cities, were paid for, and compared the debts of several of them with St. John.

The council met at 11.30 with the Mayor in the chair, all the commissioners being present. The first matter taken up was the offer of the Dominion government of \$28,670 for the lots belonging to the city, and the right of the city in the Bonnell Lot, and it was moved by Commissioner Russell, and seconded by Commissioner Wigmore, that the offer be accepted.

Commissioner McLellan moved in amendment that the offer be not accepted until it was ascertained whether the other owners were willing to accept the same figure, but this failed to find a seconder.

Commissioner Fisher thought that some arrangement should be made whereby that portion of the corner lot now used for street purposes be retained by the city, and felt that he could not support the sale unless such was done.

Commissioner Wigmore pointed out that the city was offered more now than they had been able to get in boom times, and felt that the offer should be accepted.


