

LABOR TO FIGHT WAGE REDUCTION PLANS PREPARED

Textile Unions Array Them-
selves for Battle Against
22½ Per Cent. Cuts

ENGINE COMPANY CANCELS AGREEMENT

Cigar Makers Decide to Give
Aid to Textile Unions Who
Oppose Salary Cutting.

Philadelphia, Jan. 17.—The Philadel-
phia district council of textile work-
ers, meeting here yesterday, decided
to resist to the limit of their ability
any wage reductions, and called
upon the people of Philadelphia to
support them in their struggle "for
fair play and for a chance to live as
citizens should live."

Most of the textile manufacturers
recently announced wage reductions
ranging from 10 to 25 per cent and
told the men they could either submit
to them or be thrown out of work by
the closing of the plant.

Want Wages Returned.

Lawrence, Mass., Jan. 17.—Assur-
ance that "when the time is ripe, the
United Textile Workers of America,
backed by the A. F. of L., will seek
restoration of the 22½ per cent in
wages stolen from us through the
manipulation of the employers," was
given employees of mills in this city
by Vice President Thos. F. McMahon,
of the U. T. W., in a statement is-
sued after a meeting of the local
branch of that organization yester-
day. He reminded the operatives that
his organization on Jan. 14 had ad-
vised mill workers not to strike as
the time was "not opportune."

Breaks Old Agreement.

Philadelphia, Jan. 17.—H. Mull,
president and manager of the William
Crump & Sons, ship and engine build-
ing company, announced today that
the agreement made a year ago with
the metal trades department of the
A. F. of L. had been discontinued.

The contract had provided that all
intercourse between employer and
employee should be carried on
through a representative of the union,
terminated Dec. 31.

The company's action, Mr. Mull
said, was due to the breaking of
agreements by the metal workers,
about 500 of whom went on strike
Dec. 22.

Fight Wage Reduction.

Springfield, Mass., Jan. 17.—Forma-
tion of a defense league to fight any
attempt at wage reduction was start-
ed at a meeting of 50 delegates repre-
senting every local cigar makers' union
in New England here yester-
day. It was pointed out by officials
that the wages of cigar makers have
increased only 45 per cent since 1906
and that the average pay for a week
at this time in New England is
now \$25 a week.

John Wilson.

age came to this city with his par-
ents and was employed in the office

his wife and one daughter, Miss Alice
Wilson, both of Dartmouth, and one
son, E. O. Wilson, manager of the
Royal Bank of Canada at Nookville,
Saskatchewan. The funeral will be
held on Tuesday afternoon at 2.30
from St. John's (Stone) Church.

Charles Crothers.

Apobah, Jan. 17.—Charles Crothers
died on Wednesday evening last
at his home at Lower Cove. The late
Mr. Crothers was a farmer whose
agricultural pursuits had reaped mark-
ed success and his passing at the
comparatively early age of 59 years,
is lamentable for his family and the
community where he was a highly re-
spected citizen whose life has been
commendable and a distinct loss to the
Presbyterian Church of which he was
a consistent member. He was a son
of the late Charles and Mary Jane
Crothers of Waterford, where he was
born and spent his early life, having
only been a resident here for about
20 years.

At the age of 53 years, he married
Miss Alberta Elizabeth Lison, of
Sussex, and to them were born four chil-
dren. The nearest of kin who will
mourn his death are: his wife, one
daughter, Miss Zella, and two sons,
Earle and Rutherford all at home, also
a little granddaughter, Mildred
Dickson, who has always been with
her grandparents. Of the original
family, one sister, Mrs. King McFar-
land of Sussex Corner; and three bro-
thers, William Crothers of Waterford;
Matthew and George Crothers of Low-
er Millstream, survive. A sad event,
which darkened the declining years of
the late Mr. Crothers, was the loss of
his eldest daughter, Gladys, who on
the return voyage from England,
where she had visited her soldier hus-
band, she contracted a severe cold
owing to exposure due to an accident
on the sea, from which pneumonia de-
veloped and subsequently became ter-
rific and thus her young life faded
and she passed away leaving her
infant daughter to the care of her
parents.

The funeral service took place at
the family residence on Saturday after-
noon at 2 o'clock. Rev. A. Y. Morash
officiated, after which the body was
tenderly borne to the grave in the
Upper Corner Cemetery, where the
committal service was conducted.
