Knowles). First I will read the motion, and then we may perhaps have a debate as to whether we should hear the hon. member's point of order at this time.

The President of the Privy Council (Mr. Macdonald) moved:

That the debate on the motion, "That the third report of the Standing Committee on Procedure and Organization presented to the house on Friday, June 20, 1969, be concurred in", and on any amendment or amendment in amendment proposed there-to, shall not be further adjourned.

My understanding of the procedure is that this motion should now be put to the house and disposed of, following which we will resume the debate on the motion of the hon. member for Grenville-Carleton (Mr. Blair), at which time the hon. member's point of order could be raised. Does the hon. member agree with this interpretation of the proceedings?

Mr. Stanley Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Mr. Speaker, I would have thought that now was the time to do it, but it does not make that much difference so long as it is clear that I have the right to raise the point of order. Your Honour is perfectly right in saying that my point of order is not against the procedural validity of the motion just now made by the President of the Privy Council (Mr. Macdonald) but rather that Your Honour should take certain action under Standing Order 51 with respect to the main motion, namely the motion of the hon. member for Grenville-Carleton (Mr. Blair). If I do not raise my point of order at a moment when it is possible for me to do so, I might find myself denied the floor by Standing Order 33 tonight at one o'clock.

Mr. Speaker: Order, please. I do not think it would be necessary for the hon. member for Winnipeg North Centre (Mr. Knowles) to wait until tonight at one o'clock to make his point. I think he could make it on a point of order when we resume the consideration of the motion of the hon. member for Grenville-Carleton (Mr. Blair). If the hon. member were to raise the point of order of which he has given notice at this time, I would have to tell him that it should not be raised now. If I understand his point of order correctly, his objection is not against the motion of the President of the Privy Council but against the motion of the hon. member for Grenville-Carleton.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): I am not against it procedurally but, I am against it in substance.

[Mr. Speaker.]

Mr. Speaker: All those in favour of the motion will please say yea.

Mr. Speaker: All those against the motion will please say nay.

Some hon. Members: Nay.

Mr. Speaker: In my opinion the yeas have it.
