In some places it almoet impossible for a loanning parallei get along. Thill is nearly as bad, the mud being up fo the hubs in places. At Mud Brye on Main street though not so deep in mire the road is quite as disgraceful. A large portion of the railing on, the south side is down and the re:t is just ready to follow. West

Now we a.k an intelligent and long suffering p-ople if they intend to put up with this much longer. Ther is not the slightest doubt but that much of the trouble is caus.d by bad management.
