CAMPBELL, *Hon. Sir ALEX., K.C.M.G., QC., P.C.*

S. of the late James Campbell, M.D. B. in Yorkshire, Eng., in 1822. Ed. at Lachine, at the Coll. of St. Hyacinthe, and at Kingston. M., in 1855, Georgina Frederica Locke, dau. of Thomas Sandwith, Esq. of Beverley, Yorkshire. Called to the Bar of U. C. in 1843. Apptd. a Q.C. in 1856, and is *ex officio* a Benchler of the Law Society of Ont. Was Dean of the Faculty of Law in the Univ. of Queen's Coll., Kingston, 1860. Represented Cataraqui Division in the L. C. of Canada from 1858 until the Union, in 1867; was Speaker of that body in 1862-63., Commr. of Crown Lands, and mem. of the Ex. Council from 1864 till the Union, and a mem. of the Quebec Conference. Sworn of the Privy Council, 1 July 1867. Postmaster General from thence until 1873, when apptd. Minister of the Interior. Resigned with the Macdonald Govt., 5 Nov. 1873. Was leader of the Govt. in the L.C. of Can. from 1858 until 1867, and in the Senate from the Union, in 1867, until Nov. 1873, and from thence until the resignation of the McKenzie Govt., leader of the Opposition in the Senate. Sworn as Receiver General, 8 Nov. 1878, became Postmaster General, 20 May, 1879; Minister of Militia and Defence, 16 Jan. 1880; Postmaster General, 8 Nov. 1880, and Minister of Justice 20 May 1881. Is leader of the Government in the Senate. Created K.C.M.G. by Her Majesty the Queen, 24 May 1879. Apptd. Chairman of the Commission to Consolidate and Revise the Statutes of Can., 7 June 1883. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867. A Conservative.—*Metcalf St., Ottawa; Rideau Club, Ottawa; St. James' Club, Montreal*

CARVELL, *Hon. JEDEDIAH SLASON.*

B. at Newcastle, Miramichi, N.B. M., at St. John, June, 1861, Alice Caroline, 2nd dau. of Thomas Hanford, Esq. Was Mayor of Charlottetown, 1877-78.
