

a native of Annapolis Co., N.S., and one of the earliest settlers of Richibucto, N.B. B. at Richibucto, 17 Nov., 1844. Ed. at Kent Co. Grammar Sch. Graduated B. A. at New Brunswick Univ., 23 Jan., 1864, and was Douglas Gold Medallist for that year. M. at Fredericton, 29 Oct., 1872, Fannie J., dau. of the late John Davis. Took a First-class License as Teacher, and taught Superior Sch. for 18 months. Admitted Attorney 21 Oct., 1869, and Barrister 12 Oct., 1870. Was Clerk Kent County Court from 6 Jan., 1871, and Judge of Probate from 23 July, 1878 to 1887, and has been Secty. of Kent Northern Railway Co., and Trustee of Schools for several years. First returned to Ho. of Assen., Aug. 1887, to fill vacancy caused by resignation of former member. A Liberal-Conservative. Moved the address in reply to the Lieut.-Governor's Speech, March 1888, and supported the Quebec Resolutions, while disapproving of the Unrestricted Reciprocity Resolutions of the Conference and the attitude of the Nova Scotia delegates with reference to the secession of that Province. In favour of a Lien Law, Manhood Suffrage, and Temperance and Prohibitory Legislation.—*Richibucto, N.B.*

PUGSLEY, Hon. WILLIAM, D.C.L. (*King's.*)

Paternal ancestor came from Engl., and was one of the earliest settlers on the Croton River, New York. On the breaking out of the Amer. Revol. War, great-grandf., John Pugsley, came to N.S. and settled at Napan, and afterwards returned to N. Y. His s., Daniel settled in Cardwell. S. of William Pugsley, a successful farmer near Sussex. B. at Sussex and ed. at Common Sch. there. Graduated B. A. at Univ. of N.B. in 1868; was gold medalist in Junior year and took several scholarships. Stood second in Gilchrist scholarship competition in 1868. M., 6 Jan., 1876, Fannie, dau. of late Thos. Parks, Esq., of St. John. Called to the Bar, N.B., 27 June, 1872, and was reporter of Supreme Court for ten years. First returned to Ho. of Assen. July, 1885, on death of sitting mem., Dr. Vail, and re-elected at last g.e. Elected Speaker of the House, 3 March, 1887. An Independent.—*St. John., N.B.*
