An Act to incorporate the "Institut Canadien."

W HEREAS there hath existed at Mon-Preamble. treal for several years, an Association known by the name of the Institut Canadien, founded for the purposes of union, mutual 5 instruction and progress; and for better attaining these purposes the members of the said Association have established a Library and Reading Room, and hold General Meetings every week, at which they discuss by means 10 of lectures, essays and debates, subjects adapted for the diffusion of instruction and the development of useful and practical knowledge among the inhabitants of the City of Montreal and its neighbourhood, and have

- 15 organized within the said Association, Classes of which each is occupied more especially in the study and progress of some of the Sciences and Arts; all which they have done for the benefit of the public generally, and of
- 20 the present and future Members of the Association more particularly; And whereas Vinceslas Paul Wilfred Dorion, the President, and Charles Quevillon, Auguste C. Papineau, Pierre Blanchet, François Pominville, Louis
- 25 Ricard, Charles Bonrdon, Charles Lacroix, and J. B. Edouard Tellièr, the present Officers of the said Association, have in the name and on the behalf of the said *Institut Canadien*, set forth in their petition to the Legis-
