Aiming for the top

Paddlers confident on eve of national meet

Mark Holmes and the Mississauga Canoe Club will head into the Canadian Canoe Association championships this Thursday at Dartmouth, Nova Scotia confident they can start another dynasty.

MCC has dominated flatwater paddling for the last 11 years, winning eight CCA titles. But last year the club could only manage third place behind Lachine, Quebec and Cheema of Nova Scotia.

This year, however, MCC is going into the championships with renewed vigor, according to head coach Ian Ramsay.

"We're definitely a stronger team this year," said Ramsay. "The crews are really up for the championships, much more than last year."

"After qualifying day (at the Western Ontario Division trials) last year, we weren't that confident. We were really tight because we were thinking that we haven't got that many crews competing."

MCC has even more crews for the CCA championships this year because of the addition of the midget class for the first time.

Fifty MCC paddlers have qualified for the championships including 12 midget crews.

One of those midget paddlers is Mark Holmes. And he happens to be one of the best performers for MCC this season.

Holmes has been with the club for four years. He showed his paddling prowess after one season by finishing third in bantam K-1 in the '77 CCA championships at Dartmouth.

Last year at the championship he won the juvenile K-4 with Bill Trayling, Al Thompson and Jim Wallace. He also placed fourth in the juvenile K-2 with Trayling.

In seven regattas this season, including the trials, Holmes has been unbeaten. In the K-1, K-2 and K-4, Holmes and his teammates have outstripped all their opponents.

"We can usually rely on Mark to put in strong performances," said Ramsay. "He's a very talented athlete."

Holmes, of Lorne Park Secondary School, will be competing in five events at the championships. The 15-year-old will be in the men's juvenile and midget K-1. He'll also be paddling in the juvenile K-2 with Trayling and the midget K-2 with Chris Kautzky. Holmes, Darragh Meagher, Trayling and

John McDonald will be competing in the juvenile K-4.

MCC will face stiff competition from Carterville of Quebec, especially in the ladies' kayak and men's juvenile kayak, according to Ramsay.

But MCC's quest for the championship will be strengthened by the addition of national team paddlers. Jeremy Abbott and Gregg Smith. Smith and Abbott will compete in six events each and should provide MCC with a few championships.

Ramsay also feels that the championships will give the younger paddlers important top-level experience, even if they don't fare that well. This in turn should help the club dominate flatwater paddling for the years to come.

"The championships should get the jitters out of the more inexperienced paddlers," he said. "We hope this will give them the experience to do next year what Mark Holmes is doing this year. With their improvement we can keep this team going next year and hopefully win it (the championships)."

The regatta begins tomorrow and ends Sunday.

Meadowvale 6th in Welsh Cup

Meadowvale Realty of the National Soccer League junior B ranks finished sixth out of 18 teams last week in one of the world's top junior soccer tournaments.

Meadowvale edged West Wales County 2-1 to take sixth place in the Welsh Cup played at the University of Cardiff in Wales. The team's showing in that game and during the tournament exceeded coach Bob Simms' expectations.

"There was no way we thought we would do as well as we did," said Simms. "We're ecstatic considering we were the only club side in the tournament. All the

others were select and county sides."

Meadowvale was beaten 9-0 by the eventual Cup champion, Gwent County, in the quarter-finals. Injury and fatigue on Meadowvale's part stopped the score from looking respectable as Gwent scored seven goals in the last 15 minutes.

The next day (Friday), Meadowvale bounced back to defeat West Wales County on goals by Terry Bertrand and Vern Pellizzari.

In the first match of the Cup, Meadowvale lost 2-0 to North Wales County, but came back to whip Norway 7-0 and blank

South Wales County 2-0 to qualify for the quarter-finals.

Against Norway, Rob Walcot scored twice with Bertrand, Alex Riha, Paul Collens, Pellizzari and Reg Schembri adding one goal each. Bob Irwin earned the shutout.

Eddy Pracek shutout South Wales as Pellizzari and Bertrand scored.

Meadowvale lost 4-0 to Denmark for fifth place.

Pellizzari, Meadowvale's left winger, was selected for the Rest of the World all-stars which lost 1-0 to the Welsh all-stars in a match played at the end of the Cup.
