Uplands, Ontario.	July 7th 1944		Carp lost the Safety Pennant, which Course 99 have held for some time, due to a taxying accident by F/O Jones and LAC Tamblyn. The regular Friday night dance was held in the Recreation Hall.	
	July 8th 1944		The Saturday night movie was well attended, as usual, and enjoyed by all.	
	July 9th 1944		Another "Open House" Sunday. An Army team from Lansdowne Park played softball against Uplands.	
	July 10th 1944		Fog in morning, partly cloudy in the afternoon. Only 4½ hours fit for flying. W/C A.D. Haylett, (C2986) assumes command of Unit during absence on leave of W/C W.R. Kingsland (C1972). In the evening, a Record Dance was held in the Recreation Hall for Station personnel.	
	July 11th 1944		Weather hazy, cloudy to overcast. Representatives for Briggs Oil Purifier, Mr. David Thomas from Washington, Mr. Scribber and Mr. Campbell visited Station for purpose of supervising installation of the Purifier at this Unit.	
	July 12th 1944		Rain with low clouds. Showers all day. Bad weather circuits carried out. Four hours dual only. Harvard aircraft 3062, 3295 and 3154 T.O.S.	
	July 13th 1944		C.A.V.U. Flying commenced at 0800 hours, continued for 8½ hours. "E" Flight were presented with the "Safety Pennant" by F/L Neff from Carp. W/C Bearley visited Station. He previously visited A.F.H.Q. Overseas, Aeronautical Engineering Branch, re familiarization of Maintenance of Aircraft in Canada. Uplands entered finals for the McGivern Cup by defeating Army, 4 - 2.	
	July 14th 1944		Clear to partly cloudy. Solo flying carried out for 8½ hours. F/O A.M. Hern, Station P.T. & D. Officer, S.O.S. on posting to 1 "Y" Depot. No Officer has been sent in as replacement. The R.C.A.F. Orchestra from Rockcliffe provided the music for a dance held in the Recreation Hall in the evening. Twenty-five girls were invited from groups in Ottawa. Each airman and airwoman is allowed to bring a guest. Refreshments were served.	
	July 15th 1944		Ceiling and visibility unlimited to partly cloudy. Flying washed in at 0800 hours and out at 1730 hours, with 8½ hours solo flying.	
	July 16th 1944		Weather clear. No flying. Both Church Services well attended by airmen and airwomen and their families or friends. A memorial service was held at Matcalfe United Church in Ottawa as a tribute to an Uplands graduate who was recently killed in Normandy. W/C Davies of A.F.H.Q., accompanied by a party of 25 aircrew students, one bugler and one N.C.O., attended this Service. In the afternoon, a band concert by the Rockcliffe band was held in the Pine Grove. "Open House" on Sundays are always well attended
