MEMORANDUM

CABINET WAR COMMITTEE

Re: Crown Assets Allocation Committee  
Procedure for Disposal of United  
States Surplus War Assets in Canada

Under the terms of an agreement being negotiated between Canada and the United States, governing the disposal of defense facilities surplus to United States requirements in Canada, it is contemplated that the price paid by Canada for immovables acquired shall be determined by joint appraisal; and that movables which the United States desire to leave in Canada, shall be disposed of through an agency of the Canadian Government designated for the purpose.

The Minister of Munitions and Supply reports that on the recommendation of Crown Assets Allocation Committee he has designated the Crown Assets Allocation Committee and the War Assets Corporation as the agencies of the Canadian Government for the purpose of carrying out this agreement.

It will be the responsibility of the War Assets Corporation, acting on references by the Crown Assets Allocation Committee:

- (i) to act as appraisers, in respect of immovables on behalf of the government; and, in respect of movables, to set prices under the working agreement with the United States authorities as provided; and to arrange payment to the United States authorities;
- (ii) to dispose of the items concerned.
