

motion of special meeting to deal with charges being duly given. It shall require a majority vote of all members in attendance in a Local to suspend, or a two-thirds majority to expel any member, but the formal and public expulsion shall be in the hands of the Dominion Executive Committee. The expelled member shall have the right of appeal to the Provincial or Dominion Executive Committee, and from those bodies to the general vote of the Province in which he resides, or to the general vote of the Dominion.

All expulsions and suspensions shall be at once reported to the Provincial Executive Committee.

No expelled or suspended member shall be accorded the privilege of a member of the party by any ~~branch~~ Local or committee, unless the bar of expulsion or suspension has been removed by the Local expelling or suspending such member, with the endorsement of the Dominion Executive Committee.

Sec. 10. In case of dissolution of any Local ALL property of the same must be delivered to the Provincial Executive Committee, or where no such committee exists to the Dominion Executive Committee.

Sec. 11. No Local shall enter into any compromise with any other political party, nor furnish financial aid to any other organization.

ARTICLE III.

Provincial Executive Committee.

Section 1. The Provincial Executive Committee shall be composed of seven members, to be elected by a general vote of the membership of the ~~riding~~ wherein is located the seat of the com.

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
