of the club could not warrant the expenditure of so large an amount for one of our eight committees. The equipment of the ward with all the furnishings and linen meant a tremendous lot of work and who was to undertake it and put it through?

"We asked a few kind friends for help and everyone of them responded with a generosity that surpassed our expectations. Others volunteered without being requested, and in less than three months we had over \$700. The hospital authorities kindly repaired the room, and put down a floor. Miss Ethel White, with a committee of twenty members of the May Court club, undertook the equipment of the ward. They ordered the furniture, did all the sewing and have already provided for the comfort and relief of ten poor little invalids. Their work was made much easier through the kindness of the Women's auxiliary, of the hospital, who allowed them the use of their room and sewing machines. Miss Meiklejohn and Dr. D. M. Robertson helped us as nobody else could. They were ready to give us the best
