N.B. If the active transitive verb has a direct object, this object must not be separated from the verb by an adverb.

Ex.: He loves his children tenderly.

He tenderly loves his children.

N.B. The adverb always, ever, never, often, seldom, sometimes, still, soon must be placed after the subject in simple tenses, and after the auxiliary in compound tenses

Ex.: I often see them,

Je les vois souvent.

I have rarely succeeded.

Fai rarement réussi.

Peu

Little and Few.

Little with a singular noun.

Ex.: He has little money.

Il a peu d'argent.

Few with plural nouns.

Too many with plural nouns.

Ex.: Few friends, few soldiers.

Peu d'amis, peu de soldats.

Trop

Too much—Too many—too.

Too much with a singular noun, or a verb
Ex.: He has too much ambition.

Il a trop d'ambition.

You work too much.

Vous travaillez trop.
