

N.B. If the active transitive verb has a direct object, this object must not be separated from the verb by an adverb.

Ex.: He loves his children tenderly.

He tenderly loves his children.

N.B. The adverb *always, ever, never, often, seldom, sometimes, still, soon* must be placed after the subject in simple tenses, and after the auxiliary in compound tenses

Ex.: I often see them,

Je les vois souvent.

I have rarely succeeded.

J'ai rarement réussi.

Peu

Little and Few.

Little with a singular noun.

Ex.: He has little money.

Il a peu d'argent.

Few with plural nouns,

Ex.: Few friends, few soldiers.

Peu d'amis, peu de soldats.

Trop

Too much—Too many—too.

Too much with a singular noun, or a verb

Ex.: He has too much ambition.

Il a trop d'ambition.

You work too much.

Vous travaillez trop.

Too many with plural nouns.
