The fifth volume carries the reader to TROPICAL SOUTH AFRICA, among the deserts of Damaraland and our poor fellow-men the Damaras and Ovampos, accurately delineated by the pen of Mr. FRANCIS GALTON, F.R.S., the well-known author of "Hereditary Genius," "The Art of Travel," &c.; and the volume also contains three of the notable "Vacation Tours" which the same author edited.

The sixth volume enters another field of literature with the masterpiece of modern Italian Romance, the BETROTHED LOVERS (I PROMESSI SPOSI) of ALESSANDRO MANZONI, which has been termed the greatest novel ever written, and up to the author's death had run through more than a hundred Italian editions, besides being translated into nearly all the literary languages of Europe.

The seventh volume consists of the immortal "FAUST" of GOETHE, complete, translated in the original metres by BAYARD TAYLOR, the charming American poet and man of letters, and fully annotated and elucidated by the translator. In the eighth volume, "TRAVELS ON THE AMAZON AND RIO NEGRO," Mr. ALFRED RUSSEL WALLACE, the co-discoverer of what he himself gracefully terms "Darwinism," describes his observations on the native Tribes and the Natural History of the Amazon Valley.
