

So it passed in the negative.

The question on the proposed amendment being put,

The House again divided, and the names being called for, they were taken down as follows, *videlicet* :

Yeas,

Messieurs Caron, Rofs Cuthbert, Poulin, Monro, Chaboillez, De Salaberry, James Cuthbert, M^cGill, Frobisher, Richardson, Grant, Pyke, Young, Porteous, Mondelet and Sir Alexander M^cKenzie.

Nays,

Messieurs Proulx, Vigé, Weillbrenner, Berthelot, Bourdages, Alexander Roy, Bedard and Planté.

Majority of eight in the affirmative;

And the main question, as amended, being put, a division again ensued, which proving to be the same as the foregoing,

RESOLVED, That the said Petition, without date of time or place, be dismissed.

The other order of the day being read.

On motion of Mr. Grant, seconded by Mr. James Cuthbert,

ORDERED, That the said order of the day be discharged.

RESOLVED, That this House will, to-morrow, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, to take into further consideration, that part of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor's Speech relating to the Gaol at *Montreal*. And
