Mr. Tonge then moved that fuch-Members as are intercited in the decision of the foregoing clause be not allowed to debate or vote thereon ; which being seconded and put prifed in the negative.

Mr. Tonge's original motion was put to the House, and the House dividing thereon, there appeared for the motion eleven; against it seventeen:

So it paffed in the negative.

Mr. Tonge moved that the following engroffed claufe be added to the Bill, viz. And be it further enacled, That no officer who may hereafter be cafhiered by the fentence of a general court martial, no officer who may hereafter refign his commiffion in the Militia, and no Officer who may neglect to qualify himfelf for the dutics of his flation, and fhall upon the reprefentation of one Field Officer of the Battalion to which he belongs, and of the Infpecting Field Officer of the diffrict, be on that account deprived of his commiffion by the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor=or Commander in Chief, fhall be entitled to any rank or privilege from having held fuch commiffion, or exempted from enrolment or the performance of the duties of a private M litia man : which being feconded, thereupon,

Mr. Haliburton moved the following amendment to Mr. Tonge's motion: leave out the leveral words from the word " Martial" to the word " and," which, being feconded and put, paffed in the negative.

Mr. Haliburton then moved that after the word "may" be inferted the words following, vizt. "within fix months after the publication of this Act," which being feconded and put paffed in the affirmative.

The motion for the engroffed chaufe, as amended, was then put, and, upon the queftion, thereupon agreed to by the Houfe ; and thereupon,

The engroffed cliufe was thrice read, and, upon the queftion feverally put thereupon, agreed to by the Houfe, to be made part of the Bill.

Refo'ved, That the Bill do país, and that the title be, An Act to provide for the greater fecurity of this Province by a better regulation of the Militia, and to seperat the Militia Laws now in force.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Council, and defire their concurrence to the fame.

Then the Houfe adjourned until Monday at ten of the clock.
