A Bill, entitled, An Act to carry into effect an Act, passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, in the fifty-ninth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, entitled, An Act to enable His Majesty to make regulations with respect to the taking and curing Fish on certain parts of the Coasts of Newfoundland and Labrador, and His Majesty's other Possessions in North America, according to a Convention made between His Majesty and the United States of America.
