CAP. XVI.

AN ACT for Granting to Her Majesty a Sum of Money for Defraying the Expenses of the Civil Government of this Colony, for the Year ending on the Thirty-first day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-three, and for other purposes.

[Passed 15th June, 1853.]

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY ;---

'E, Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Commons of Preamble. Newfoundland, having freely and voluntarily resolved to give and grant unto Your Majesty a Supply to defray certain Charges for the support of the Civil Government, for the Administration of Justice, and the General Improvement of this Colony, do humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, in $\pounds 31,122$ 5s. 6d. Legislative Session convened, That from and out of such monies as shall for the year endfrom time to time remain in the hands of the Treasurer, and unappro- ing 31st Dec., priated, there be granted to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, 1853. the sum of Thirty-one Thousand One Hundred and Twenty-two Pounds Five Shillings and Six Pence; which said sum of Money shall be applied in payment of the following charges for the Year commencing on the First day of January One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-three, and ending on the Thirty-first day of December in the same year; that is to say :---

The sum of Four Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-six Pounds towards defraying the Salaries of the undermentioned Officers, as follows- Salaries of-

The Clerk of the Executive Council, Two Hundred Pounds. Two Clerks in the Secretary's Office, Four Hundred Pounds. An Office-keeper to the Secretary's Office, Sixty Pounds. A Messenger at the Secretary's Office, Sixty Pounds. The Colonial Treasurer, Five Hundred Pounds.
