RELIEF FOR IRELAND. Gueiph, Jan. 25.—A well attended meeting of ratepayers was held in the City Hall tonight to discuss the situation in Ireland, Mayor Sleeman in the chair. The meeting was addressed by Mr. Peter O'Leary, late from Ireland, who gave a harrowing tale of the woe that now prevails. Addresses were also given by several prominent citizens and a num-ber of resolutions passed unsaimously, among them being one petitioning the City Council to appropriate the sum of 500.00 for the relief of the distressed in Ireland, and the Mayor to forward that amount to the Lord Mayor of Dublin.
