Berlin, Feb. 20— (Bx wireless to Sayville) — The Overseas News Agency announces that the Hamourg prize court has confirmed the onfiscation of Dutch bonds, bound for New York, which were seized or board the Dutch steamer Prinz Heqdrik, which was taken into a Ger-man port September 23, 1916, by a derman warship. Of this amount 4.935,000 rancs were claimed by Madame Leaudy, wife of Jackues Lebaudy, known as "emperor of the Sahara." The plaintiffs in the action wer essed the costs of the trial.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Ap-Manitoba, Saskatchewan of Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homograder may live within cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead.
