The reason the strike is not quickly settled is the refusal of President Oliphant of the Delaware & Hudson road and President Truesdale of the Delaware & Lackawanna to co-operate with presidents of other coal roads who are willing to accept Hanna as arbitrat-

The miners realizing the hopelessness of a settlement without these two roads have determined to bting all pressure possible to force a settlement or as an alternative to call out one million men.

The place is expected to surrender any moment.
