THE PRESIDENT AT ST. LOUIS

Assists in Dedicating Buildings Now in Course of Construction - Crowd of People Estimated at 300,000 Assembled to Witness the Proceedings of the Event.

St. Louis, May 4.—President Roosevelt fought his way through the biggest crowd he ever encountered in his life at the fair grounds on Saturday. He assisted in dedicating the half completed buildings and accompanied them in the name of the government from the National Commission whose duty it has been to see that the \$5,000,000 given by congress shall be expended as judiciously as the circumstances permit.
