OTTAWA, March 6. In the Honse of Commons, to-day, Mr. Casey resumed the budget debate, criticising the Government's fiscal policy from a farmε1's point of view. He compared the finance minister to Professor Wiggins, who claimed when storms which he predicted did not come to time that it was not his fault, that his prophecy was all right but that something must have gone wrong with the ele-ments. Sir Leonard 'Tilley's N. P. had proved a disastrous failure, but the minis-terialists had not the manliness to admit the fact and retrace their steps; their great panacea for commercial ills had failed, and now they were admitting that the depres-sion which they were powerless to prevent prevailed throughout the land.
