MECHANISM OF VITAL ACTIONS.

The remainder of the water they evaporated, and the salt they obtained they boiled with lead. This lump of impure lead they placed on a saucer made of lime, and then submitted it to a heat sufficient to melt the lead, but not to affect the silver, should any be present.

One pound of green copperas, costing seven cents, dissolved in one quart of water, and poured into a tea-pool, will effectually concentrate and destroy the foulest smells. For water-closets, aboard of ships and steamboats, about hotels, and other public places, there is nothing so nice to cleanse places as simple green copperas dissolved; and for sick rooms, it may be placed under the bed in any thing that will hold water, and thus render a hospital or other place for the sick free from unpleasant smells.
