This appeal which has been brought in order to determine the validity of the New Brunswick Liqor Export Tax Act. and resulted from an action involving some \$60. 060, was expected to be heard next month, but owing to the necessity of obtaining the respondent's consent and other delays, the Privy Council hearing will stand over until the February term.
