Prisoners in Paris.

PARIS, Sept. 21. After having become accustomed to good news during the days of the Germans withdrawal, Paris was made a little nervous through the silence of the War Office. The capital is now reassured by the steady file of prisoners arriving from the scene of prisoners arriving from the scene of action. Saturday, 1,500 prisoners were brought here; Friday, 1,200 arrived, and on the preceding days since the Germans first fell back, 1,000 and 1,500 have been the daily average. More than 10,000 prisoners of war are now here. The reference in last night's official statement, which spoke of numerous prisoners, further encouraged the people of the city.
