

The members of Gower Street Methcdist Sunday School were yesterday priviledged in having with them Hon. J. A. Robinson, who had been asked by the Superintendent, Mr. W. H. Peters, to give the School a talk on the happenings of the past two weeks, but particularly on the life and death of Earl Kitchener.

(Under the distinguished Patronage of His Excellency the Governor, Sir Walter E. Davidson, K.C.M.G., and of the Colonel and Officers of the Newfoundof Earl Kitchener. Every boy in the school knew of

Earl Kitchener, to every boy he was a hero, but as Mr. Robinson sketched his life, briefly told of his career i the Army, of the battles he had fought, the honors he had won; as he told Wednesday next, 14th how when the war broke out, Kitchen-er, home in England on furlough, was fice, he loyally gave himself again for service; how, under his leadership the Army grew steadily day by day the Army grew steadily day by day, till eighteen months after it was declared it numbered five million men; as he told that at the very moment when his critics were bitterest, he The following La was planning, silently and carefully, his last journey and business for his King; as he imagined the last scenes on the deck of the Hampshire or in Johnson, Estelle Johnson, Emthe life-boat; as he described the survivors from the ship with their last breath murmuring "Kitchener, Kitchener," the silence was intense. Every boy was listening breathlessly. His Williams. appeal to the boys, in whatever sphere of life their work may be, humble or exalted, to ever do their duty, made on impression that will be lasting. He quoted Lord Tennyson's poem "The Revenge," where Sir Richard Grenville, fighting to the Richard Grenville, fighting to the death with his one ship against the enemy's fifty-three, said:

"We have fought such a fight for a day and a night As may never be fought again."

It was not Horatio Herbert Kitchener's to fall on the battlefield, or in under direction of Prof. King. and a half in bringing his small army of 150,000 men up to a voluntary army of 5,000,000 as may never be fought again. With Sir Richard he (The Hall for this occasion) too could say:
"I have fought for King and Faith as

a valiant man and true, I have only done my duty as a man

bound to do. In concluding his appeal, the speaker said, "What matter where, or when, or how we die, whether we lie in a thousand fathoms of water, or in six feet of earth, if we too can say, 'I have only done my duty as a man is bound to do.' 'Kitchener dead!' he said, 'Never,' Kitchener lives! and will live to the end of time."

Mr. Robinson also made reference to the loss Gower Street School has met in the death of three of her boys of former days—Jack Chaplin, who was the first of "Ours" to lay down his life, not on the battlefield, but no less in service; his brother Hal, who went to his death with Kitchener, and Ned Peters, the nephew of the School Superintendent and son of a former Superintendent. "These three," he said, "have done their duty."



### Destructive Fire.


