#### THE PIG.

Every time the farmer ships thirty-two chubby-faced pigs to market some real money is put into active circulation, and the country merchant feels more like advertising and contributing to the church.

The pig never used to know his ancestors from a hole in the ground, but nowadays every pig that amounts to anything has a family tree with more branches on it than a cranberry bush. A stalwart pig that can trace his ancestry back to the reign of James K. Polk will oftentimes sell for more money than a serial story by Robert W. Chambers, which shows that as a people we are coming to a higher appreciation of literature. Refined people who have never owned a pig sneer at him on account of his uncouth ways, but this is because they have never seen him lift a mortgage or remove a plaster from a red barn.

### Ireland to-day an Isle of Gold.

Dublin, Sept. 13.—"The Emerald Isle has become lately an Isle of gold and diamonds!"

"America's last-year spruce of war-time prosperity has been emulated here, on a smaller scale. War profits have converted this land, which used to complain of poverty, into a country of rejoicing in new riches and reaching out for more!"

Without standing sponsor for these assertions made to American correspondents here by enthusiastic advocates of the great Irish convention now hard at work, one may truthfully say that to-day in Ireland there are few signs of the misery it is said used to mark Irish life.

Here in Ireland the war seems far away. Food is excellent, plentiful, comparatively cheap. Life is easy, pleasant and far less oppressed by the war than in England. Those in America who sympathize with the Sinn Féin movement for independence must henceforth buttress their sympathy only with visions and ideals of nationality.

#### Linen for Airplanes.

America's vast aviation plans have brought especial joy to Ireland. It takes 150 yards of the finest cambric to make the wings of a single one of these thousands of airplanes America plans to build. "And this cloth can come only from Ireland," say the enthusiasts. "Irish linen, made from Irish flax, can have practically monopoly prices henceforth."

#### Nine Million Yards!

Said one authority, "America's huge military aviation scheme alone will call for over nine million yards of Irish linen, a strip of cambric over 6,000 miles long! In one airplane the monster ship's wings would span the whole Atlantic from New York to Queenstown!"

Ireland expects also to be the terminus of the trans-Atlantic aerial service, which aviation experts are predicting after the war.

While the Irish farmer is prosperous as never before, the industrial north, especially the Belfast ship-building district, has had its war prosperity. And to Dublin the Irish convention has brought not only crowds and money, but the dawn of a new hope for a self-governed and prosperous Ireland.

### Passing of the Hon. James Ryan.

We regret to record the passing of the Hon. James Ryan, for years one of the most prominent personalities in the country. He died at his home, some time in poor health, worse a few days ago, at eight o'clock last night, leaving a widow, nee Carthy, of Carbonear, and a resident in England, and two brothers, Daniel and James.

James Ryan was a Newfoundlander, being born in 1841. From modest beginnings he rose to the position of one of the most prominent personalities in the country until he became a first and dominant figure in his native town. His management to large branches were extended to Catalina, Labrador and his remarkable success in his one of the most prominent in the Island, was due to his possession of two important qualities, a love of his business ability to save, and an able rule, it has been said, upon the country. He was won.
