And yet I have just been reminded that there is a certain type of person who, under certain circumstances, sings the song of poverty too much instead of too little.

The Allies and the Holy See.

On Monday last the Prince of Wales visited the Pope at the Vatican. This act of deference towards the Head of the Roman Church, whose adherents number many millions among the peoples of the British Empire, was right and proper. The visit was obviously made with the consent and approval of the Italian Government. Our Rome correspondent reported that it gave "keen satisfaction to the Vatican and Catholic circles generally." On Thursday it was announced that, in pursuance of an appeal received through the Vatican from the Cardinal Archbishop of Cologne, the British Government had consented for "religious and humane" reasons that no British aircraft should be made during daylight that day, the Feast of Corpus Christi, on cities not in the vicinity of the battle-front. On the same day the German long-range guns bombarded Paris, as they did on Good Friday and Easter Sunday, struck a wrong course.
