Seven Russellites

Taken to Atlanta.

"Pastor" Rutherford and the six ther Russellites who have been sentenced to twenty years each in the Federal prison in Atlanta, Ga., for sedition, will be safely behind the bars there at 6 o'clock this evening.

They were taken from the Queen's County jail yesterday afternoon in time to catch the 1.08 train at the Pennsylvania Station. Only the members of their immediate families were S. Marshal Power planned their departure in this way so there would be no demonstration at the jail or at the station. He succeeded admirably and would only admit this afternoon, when he knew the prisoners were near their journey's end, that they had left Long Island City.

Jacob J. Keller, the post office clerk, who was sentenced to a year and a day in the Atlanta prison, was taken along with them. They were accompanied by a deputy marshal.-


