### Orphans Entertained Last Night

Last night was a gala night at the Church of England Orphanage. The Methodist Guards Band, accompanied by the Prince's Orchestra and a large number of well known city artists visited the Shannon Munn Memorial Institution and gave the little folk a delightful programme of vocal and instrumental music. The musicians and their friends were conveyed to the Orphanage in motor cars arranged for by the Orphanage Club.

The Concert began at 8.30, with Hon. Dr. Mosdell acting as Chairman. The first item on the programme was a march "Solid Front," by the Methodist Guards Band, conducted by Bandmaster C. Peet. Other selections played in good style by the Band during the evening were: "Honey Girl," "Popper Up," and "Soldiers of the King." The Prince's Orchestra, under Mr. W. Darcy, also created great enthusiasm amongst the delighted audience of boys and girls with their excellent renditions of popular dance music.

On the vocal side the programme included the following items:—"Anchored," by Miss Lena Driscoll; "Swanee River Dream," R. Redmond; "When Honey Sings An Old-Time Song," Miss K. Hayes; "Carry me back to Old Virginia," E. Snow; "Rose of my Heart," H. Chaplin; and, "Absent," by Messrs. Chaplin and Redmond. A specially interesting feature was an instrumental solo, played on an ordinary hand-saw, by H. Diamond.

The restrained, but spontaneous and whole-hearted enthusiasm of the children, their evident thorough enjoyment of the proceedings and their cheerful responses to the witticisms of the chairman, were a delight to all connected with the affair and were ample reward to the Bandmen, the members of the Orchestra and the other friends who shared in the event. Encores were played by the band and were liberally responded to by all the performers in a whole-hearted desire to provide the kiddies with the greatest degree of pleasure that could be furnished in one evening. The behavior of the boys and girls was particularly good and was the cause of many compliments to Mr. J. Andrews and to Mrs. White, the Superintendents.

The piano accompaniments of the evening were played by Misses M. Doran and Jean Joyce.

After the musical programme concluded, Hon. Dr. Mosdell expressed appreciation for the kindly interest of the visiting musicians in the well-being of the orphans. He spoke of their good offices on behalf of the other institutions and asked Bandmaster Peet and Mr. Darcy and their associates to accept the thanks of the Superintendents, the children and the managers for their kindly thought and effort. Mr. H. Chaplin responded on behalf of the Band and associates, and expressed appreciation to the Orphanage Club for providing motor car transportation for the half hundred who shared actively in the evening's programme.

The evening's events concluded with a lavish spread of supper for the children and their performers. It was provided by the lady assistants of the Guards Band and was a fitting wind-up for the healthy appetites that accompany sound juvenile physiques such as were in evidence amongst the boys and girls of the institutions. A feast of music succeeded by a feast of good food made a happy combination for the orphan children.

The Orphanage Club, the musicians and their associates express thanks to Messrs. C. C. Pratt, James Pratt, E. Snelgrove, Hon. John Davey, D. R. Thistle, T. W. Sparkes, G. Hutchings, who assisted Hon. Dr. Mosdell, B. B. Stafford and E. Lawrence, of the Club, in conveying the visitors to the institution by motor cars.
