OUTLOOK IN THE EAST.

From Present Indications There Will Be Squalls Soon.

Admiral Seymour's Flagship and Several Other British Warships Suddenly Leave Hai Mai Wei Under Sealed Orders—The Restoration of Russian Predominance Behind the Chinese Throne Gives an Ugly Turn to Affairs.

Wei Hai Wei, Sept. 26.—The British battleship Centurion, flagship of Vice-Admiral Sir Edward H. Seymour, the commander of the British fleet in Chinese

waters, sailed suddenly on Friday, under sealed orders, accompanied by Che-Foo by the battleship Victoria, the first-class cruiser Narcissus, the second-class cruiser Hermione, the torpedo boat destroyer Fame, the torpedo boat Alacrity. It is supposed that the destination of the fleet is Ta Ku, at the entrance of the river leading to Tien Tsin, the port of Peking, for the purpose of making a naval demonstration there.

British Consul Protests.
Shanghai, Sept. 26.—The British Consul has entered a protest against the action of the Chinese officials in stopping the steamer Eldorado and searching her for Kang, the Cantonese reformer. The British naval commander, contemplating landing a party of sailors and marines at Ta Ku. The Consul (governor) has asked the assistance of the British Consul in capturing Kang, who he describes as a degraded criminal. There is no doubt that if he is arrested he will be promptly executed.

Ceded to the Russians.
London, Sept. 23.—A despatch to the Globe from Hong Kong, published yesterday afternoon, purports to give details of the secret convention signed at Peking on March 27. It appears that Hsu Ying Kwei of the Chinese Foreign Office thereby concluded an agreement with St. Petersburg by which China ceded Port Arthur and Ta Lien Wan, stipulating that only Russian and Chinese warships enter or dock at Port Arthur. Russia, it also appears, gets the exclusive use of the inner harbor of Ta Lien Wan, the sole administration of the ceded territories, and a tract of land north of Ta Lien Wan is designated as a buffer-belt.

Resigned His Power.
Peking, Sept. 23.—An Imperial edict just issued definitely announces that the Emperor of China has resigned his power to the Empress (dowager Empress), who has ordered the Ministers to deliver to her, in future, their official reports.

Kang Finds a Refuge.
Shanghai, Sept. 25.—It is reported that Kang Yuwei, the Cantonese reformer, who is accused by the Dowager Empress of being implicated in designs on the Emperor's life, and who recently fled from Peking, arrived at Woo Sung, near here, on Saturday, and took refuge on board a British gunboat.

RUSSIA OFFERS TROOPS.
Czar's Minions Incensed Because Their Game Has Been Blocked.

London, Sept. 26.—A special despatch from Shanghai says that Kang Yuwei's brother, the Chinese reformer, has been arrested in Peking and is being held in custody. The despatch also says that Sir Claude MacDonald, the British Minister, gave instructions that Kang Yuwei should be protected from arrest. The British Consulate holds his baggage and documents referring to state secrets. The Russians are incensed at the latter fact and it is reported that Russia has offered the Dowager Empress the service of 10,000 troops from Port Arthur to keep order in Peking if necessary. It is stated that the British fleet in Chinese waters has been divided between Ta Ku and Shanghai, under orders to intercept Russian transports in the event of an attempt to land troops.

Li Hung's Enemy Arrested.
London, Sept. 26.—The Times' Peking correspondent says: "Chang Yin Huan, the Cantonese enemy and rival of Li Hung Chang, who is charged with harboring Kang Yuwei, has been arrested. He is now under trial by the Board of Punishment. He will be stripped of all his offices, his removal giving increased power to Li Hung Chang."

"The officials generally welcome the Empress' return to power, but the people are indifferent. Kang Yuwei is charged with conspiring against the Empress Dowager and has been declared an outlaw and his arrest has been ordered."

Alarming News From Philippines.
London, Sept. 26.—The Globe says alarming information has been received by the Government as to the position of the British residents in the Philippines. The British gunboat Battler of the China station has been ordered to proceed with all possible speed to the Island of Cebu, in the central part of the Philippines, where the British community is said to be in imminent danger from the natives.

TOLD MARCHAND TO GO.

Union Jack Hoisted at Fashoda While the French Protested. Last of the Derivatives Crushed.

London, Sept. 26.—The Daily Telegraph's Cairo correspondent, telegraphing today (Monday) says: General Kitchener found the French at Fashoda. He notified Major Marchand that he had express instructions that the territory was British, and the French must retire, and offered them passage to Cairo. Major Marchand absolutely declined to retire unless ordered to do so by his Government. No fighting occurred. Major Marchand was given clearly to understand that the British insisted upon their claims, and the rest has been left to be settled by diplomatic means between the respective Governments.

General Kitchener sent a long official despatch to London, hoisted the Union Jack and the Egyptian ensign, and left as a garrison the 13th and 15th Sudanese Battalions and the Cameron Highlanders to protect the British flag. Col. Jackson commands the garrison.

Kitchener at Omdurman.
Cairo, Sept. 26.—General Kitchener, commanding the Anglo-Egyptian expedition, has returned to Omdurman, having established posts at Fashoda and on the Sobat River. The troops did no fighting except with a Dervish steamer on the way south, which was captured.

Last of the Derivatives Crushed.
Snakin, Sept. 26.—The only organized remnant of the Khalifa's army was defeated and its last stronghold, Gedara, captured on Sept. 23, after three hours' hard fighting, when an Egyptian force numbering 1,300, under command of Col. Parsons, routed 3,000 Dervishes, of whom 500 were killed. Three British soldiers killed and 50 wounded.

Will Not Be Hanged.
Because There is No Law for Hanging in Switzerland—Prison for Life Is Lucce's Fate.
Geneva, Switzerland, Sept. 24.—Lucce, the anarchist slayer of Empress

Elizabeth, will not suffer death for his crime. Capital punishment is not inflicted in Switzerland, and there is no longer talk of extradition. The Swiss are too conservative to disregard their national constitution, which provides in precise, positive language that persons who commit crimes in Swiss territory must be judged by Swiss courts. It is not believed that extradition will be demanded, but if it is it will be refused.

Lucce's fate is settled. He will be confined for life in St. Antoine Prison, in Geneva. He will have to work at shoemaking every day, except Sunday, and he never will be permitted to speak a word to anybody except the prison guard.

It is a miserable existence. The only other life prisoner in Geneva is a parrot, who is said to be kept giving way under the terrible strain. It will be particularly hard for Lucce, for he loves, above all things, to talk. The trial probably will not take place before November.

ALL EYES ON FRANCE.
The Situation Has Reached a Most Alarming Stage.
London, Sept. 26.—The alarming situation in France rivets the attention of Europe. The excitement is increasing hourly, new revelations and developments are expected and a military coup d'état would surprise anybody. Slight demonstrations were made late Sunday afternoon, but the crowds which gathered were quickly dispersed by the police.

Further Postponed.
Paris, Sept. 26.—The Cabinet met on Saturday and decided to postpone its decision on the question of the proposed revision of the Dreyfus case until today, the 27th.

Four of the Great Powers Sign an Agreement to That Effect.
Rome, Sept. 26.—Within 24 hours Great Britain, Russia, France and Italy will append their signatures to an agreement for the peaceful solution of the Dreyfus case, including a plan for coercing the Sultan into submission. The scheme has for some time been drafted, but its enforcement was delayed to invite the participation of Germany, which country declined. At the beginning of the week the four powers will send an ultimatum to the Sultan of Turkey summoning him to accept the project, and informing him that unless he does so measures will be taken to enforce his compliance. The powers have irrevocably decided to settle the Dreyfus question immediately and will not hesitate to send their fleets to the Dardanelles, and beyond if necessary.

MR. CURZON ELEVATED.
The New Viceroy to India Is Baron Curzon of Kedleston.

London, Sept. 24.—It is officially announced that the Hon. George Curzon, lately Secretary of State for India, has been appointed Viceroy of India, the Earl of Elgin as Viceroy of India, has been elevated to the peerage as Baron Curzon of Kedleston.

Deaths From Lightning.
Portage la Prairie, Sept. 26.—Saturday afternoon about 3 o'clock W. Nicholson, employed with W. Beattie, near McDonald, was killed by lightning and J. Cooper was seriously hurt. Six horses were also killed. All were in the stable when the accident occurred. Both men were recent arrivals from Ontario.

William Black, 19 years old, was killed by lightning whilst standing in his stable doorway at Franklin, near here, the same afternoon.

Now Out of Danger.
Plantagenet, Ont., Sept. 26.—Hon. Alfred Evanston, Speaker of the Ontario Legislature, who has been very ill for several days, has taken a change for the better and on Saturday evening was considered out of danger. He is still confined to his room.

UNCLASSIFIED.
The McKenzie-Mann trail from Glenora to Teslin has been completed. Meridian, Mass., is now enforcing a curfew law that makes men go indoors by 8 p.m. or pay \$25 fine.

The eruption of Vesuvius is increasing in violence, and it is feared that it will assume the proportions of that of 1872. According to the latest facts, several powers have decided to hold in October a conference for the purpose of considering and adopting measures for the suppression of anarchy.

The pet eagle of Troop B, First Illinois Cavalry, stationed at Fort Sheridan, has swooped down and robbed a lady guest of the gay plumed bird which adorned her hat. There is trouble in the camp over the incident.

Miss Russell, dam of Maud S., the first mare to trot better than 2:10, died at the home of her owner, A. J. Alexander in Woodford County, Kentucky, last week, aged 33. She was probably one of the most famous brood mares in the world.

The Provincial Board of Health reports that during the month of August 203 people died. Out of this number 34 had died from fever, as against 12 last year. Diphtheria carried away 16, consumption 152, whooping cough 12, scarlatina 10, measles 6.

Sir William Van Horne in an interview said he would place the world's wheat famine a year or two later than Sir William Crookes, who named 1931. The latter had evidently not been informed that Canada has yet 100,000,000 acres of unoccupied wheat land.

Capt. Nicholson of the schooner Eliza Fisher reported to Chief Horsey of Kingston that he had passed a "float" between Cedar Island and Long Point light. It was impossible for him to stop at the time. He believes it was the body of a woman, the hair being very long.
